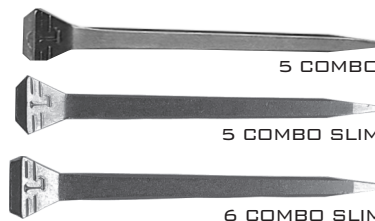

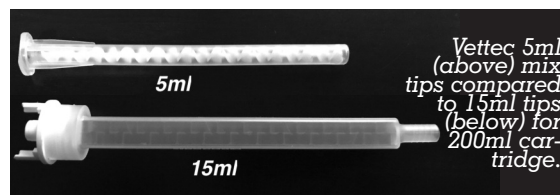

Kerkchaert Steel Triumph Lite Unclipped

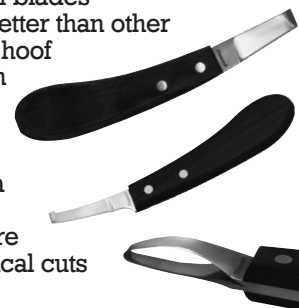
